## <u>Citizenship 3</u> Key stage 2 - Who else looks after animals?

As a class or group, discuss why we keep pets. Make notes.


- What pets do you have at home?
- Why do you have them?
- Why were those animals chosen to be your pet?
- Who looks after your pets? (YOU, I hope!) What do you have to do?
- What special equipment do you have to have, e.g. tanks, leaders, etc.
- Who pays the bills for food and vet's fees?

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Discuss: The legal age to own a pet is 12. Why do you think that might be?

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These animals need homes to go to. A number of families are looking for a pet. Discuss between you what sort of pet would suit which family. (Make up the families – elderly person alone, family with two very small children, etc.) You could do this as role-play, or as an interview.



Are all of these animals suitable as pets? Why/why not?
