## Can you help the badgers navigate around their territory?

(Badger territory size depends upon how much food there is available to the animals.)

The badgers can only move vertically  $\hat{\downarrow}$  or horizontally along the grids.

The sett lies under the large oak tree.

- The badgers have come out of the sett as the sun goes down. Old Brock wants
  to go to the clearing in the middle of the forest. Can you guide him there?
  Here's how to do it: Set off from the sett in square 5 l. Go west to square 3 l.
  Turn north and go to square 3 E.
- 2. Young Bessie Badger wants to go the house with the pink roof, where she knows there'll be something to eat in the garden. (Hopefully, she won't dig up the lawn!) She'll have to cross the river by the bridge. Can you guide her there?
- 3. Bertie wants to travel to the fields where he knows there will be lots of worms.

  Can you guide him there? Avoid the fields where the big diggers are digging out a large pipeline!
- 4. Brenda knows that there are always lots of cowpats in the meadow. There's always lots of juicy grubs under the pats! Can you take her to the cow pasture?
- 5. The cubs want to go to the pond for a drink. (Actually, badgers get most of their water from the worms they eat.) In which direction should they travel?
- 6. How can Bart get to the sheep pasture? (He'll need to cross the river.)



- 7. Barbara wants to go to the old dead tree, but she doesn't want to pass through the farm. Can you take her there?
- 7. The night is passing quickly and Bob and Betty love to watch the sun rise before they go back to bed in the sett. At the moment, they are at the tree, in square 2 L. Can you quide Bob and Betty from there to the sunrise hill?

Thank you for helping the badgers to find their way around their territory. (Of course, badgers find their way around their territory very easily.)
