- Wash your hands thoroughly BEFORE you touch your mouth or food.

There's tons of stuff out there to help you discover more! Start by borrowing from your school or local library. Don't be afraid to ask for help, if you can't find what you want. Borrowing from your friends can help you to find out what you like best.
